

RESOLUTION 18-06

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MILLIKEN
SUPPORTING A “YES” VOTE ON BALLOT ISSUE 1A IN THE APRIL 3, 2018 TOWN
OF MILLIKEN ELECTION**

WHEREAS, the Town Board has referred a ballot question relating to the extension of the Town’s .05% sales and use tax to allow the Town to continue to allocate revenues from such sales and use tax for necessary Town improvements; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the Colorado Fair Campaign Practices Act, the Town Board desires to adopt a resolution in support of ballot issue 1A.

**BE IT REOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF
MILLIKEN, COLORADO THAT:**

Section 1. The Town Board of Trustees urges registered electors to vote “yes” on ballot issue 1A in the April 3, 2018 election for the following reasons:

1. The Town presently imposes a sales and use tax at the rate of 2.5%, of which .5% was approved by the voters in 2002 as a temporary sales and use tax rate increase solely to provide for capital improvements related to signalization and traffic control devices at the intersection of State Highway 60 and State Highway 257; and

2. The temporary sales and use tax rate increase is set to terminate on the earliest permitted date following the payment in full of the revenue bonds issued to pay for the traffic signal at the intersection of State Highway 60 and State Highway 257; and

3. The Town Board must seek voter approval to extend the .50% sales and use tax and urges registered electors to vote “yes” in support of such sales and use tax extension; and

4. A “yes” vote will allow the Town to use the revenues generated from .50% sales and use tax to acquire, construct, repair and improve public improvements and Town capital assets as determined necessary by the Board of Trustees; and


5. A “yes” vote will provide residents of the Town with needed public improvements including but not limited to additional traffic signalization at key intersections within Milliken that will improve the safety and welfare of the residents of Milliken;

6. A “yes” vote will not increase the current 2.5% sales and use tax rate, but will simply allow the Town to continue to collect the full 2.5% sales and use tax for the benefit of the community.

Section 2. This Resolution is effective upon adoption by the Board.
