I will take over the business and the name will be changed in the near future to receive a provisional license until a license is granted by the state. With this agreement the concern of the building lease has also been negotiated and determined to keep the building open for a Daycare/Preschool indefinitely. As the details are worked out more information will be released to you. We are alive and well and our children will continue to flourish and grow as it has always been our intent.

You have gone to the Town of Milliken meeting and made your voice heard, written letters, posted on social media, called the Weld County Commissioner Julie Cozad and even called the news stations to get the attention of our community to get something resolved.
