WORD FROM THE MAYOR

Construction for the sidewalk improvements nears completion at the intersection of Hwy 60 and Hwy 257. This completes the westbound sidewalk on Hwy 60 with ADA curb ramps and pedestrian crossings. When construction occurs on CDOT roads all four corners are to be completed as per requirements of the Colorado Department of Transportation. The Town will continue completing gaps along Quentine to Rd 46 ½ and then west as part of the Milliken/Johnstown trail to Road 19. We will continue on our gap analysis of all sidewalks and tie in these areas as part of our capital improvement plans.

As part of Milliken's water plan, a one million gallon water storage tank has been purchased and will be located at the south edge of town near the Wildcat Acres subdivision. The construction is scheduled for this summer and will be operational by fall.

Milliken celebrated its 12th year as a Tree City USA on Arbor Day last month. Local Girl Scout Troop 73,000 participated in the tree planting with Josh Roseberry and his crew, as well as a representative from the Colorado State University Forestry Service. The celebration was held at FBC park in the Frank Farms subdivision. Two officers from the North Colorado Health Alliance were in attendance to commission the installation of Milliken's second "Little Free Library" at the park following the tree plantings. Students from KQA contributed to the art work and design.

Major as well as minor projects will continue to meet the needs of Milliken residents and to provide and improve our services and amenities.
