

The Town Board periodically receives reports from the Police Department regarding activities, citations, court cases, and statistics. Projects

- Weld County Sheriff's office came to the Milliken Police Department and conducted a brief overview of the new Sex Offender Tracking System, called SOTAR is a new system that will help us better track offenders, beginning with their first registration on down to the yearly state mandated compliance checks. Implementation of this system has begun.
- The Police department is currently in the implementation stages of adding RAIDS ONLINE, a crime mapping system that
 allows citizens to view police activity in Milliken but most importantly providing transparent in the work that the police department does for our citizens. It's also a good tool for Neighborhood Watch programs in tracking activity in their neighborhoods.
- Training CIRSA conducted a POST certification course called Below 100 on September 12th at the Milliken Police Station. Below 100 is an Initiative to Reduce Police LODD's (Law Enforcement Duty Deaths) to Fewer Than One Hundred per Year. The purpose of the training is to promote officer safety awareness and better driving habits while on the road.

Community Engagement Community Policing Projects

- The Police Department was able to take 21 youths from the community of Milliken Boys and Girls club and from Milliken's Community Court to see the Colorado Rockies on July 24th. The Rockies organization donates Community Tickets to the Police Department each year and Subway donates sandwiches. This give us an opportunity to take youths that have never experienced a Rockies game.
- National Night Out was held on Tuesday August 5th 2014. We had over 300 citizens attend this year.
- Chief Garcia spoke at the senior luncheon on Monday August 4th. The chief spoke about door to door solicitation and safety awareness.
- The Town's Annual Halloween Party will be held at the Middle school on October 25th from 5:30pm to 8:00 pm for children up to 5th grade.
